- b. Pajaro Compass Network Stakeholder Meeting Wednesday, October 24th -- The Pajaro Compass is a partnership among conservation, agriculture, transportation, government, and community representatives who champion the many values of the Pajaro River Watershed for people and nature.

d. Livestock & Land Grants Available to Improve Drainage on Livestock Properties

The Loma Prieta and San Benito Resource Conservation Districts (RCDs) are offering \$175,000 in grants to local livestock owners in southern Santa Clara and San Benito Counties located within the Pajaro River Watershed. Funds from the Livestock and Land Program can help pay for improvements to livestock and horse properties for managing drainage, erosion, stormwater

The Symposium will take place in Monterey, CA from Nov. 7-10. The focus will be on land management to learn about the latest findings in invasive plant biology and management and celebrate another year of weed work across the state. They will have a special training on preventing Phytophthora from ruining your restoration, and field trips to Big Sur, Elkhorn Slough (including kayaking), Fort Ord, and the Salinas River.
